

Academic Resources for Parents & Scholars at Home

Below are some FREE reading resources that you might find helpful if you want to give your scholars something academic to do or if you just want to let them read for fun (note: sometimes free versions have less options).

Reading

- **News-ELA:** Non-Fiction articles only (Grades 3 and up) – Many scholars have an account. You can create an account if you prefer. You can assign articles or scholars can pick their own. There are short quizzes and writing prompts that you could assign and review.
- **Common-Lit:** Articles (Grades 3 and up) – Another reading platform that allow you to create an account and assign articles or have kids read what they like. It also has videos with some articles and a Parent Guide with each article to help you discuss with your child.
- **Renaissance Learning's My-On reading:** E-Books (Grades Pre-K to 8): Lots of “read-to-me” e-book options, including graphic novels. Scholars can search by interest but parents need to check reading level (<https://gafcp.org/wp-content/uploads/2020/03/Renaissance-Get-Georgia-Reading-At-Home.pdf>)
- **Epic:** E-Books (Grades Pre-K to 5): Has audio books and read-to-me books, learning videos, comic books and textbooks, and a built-in dictionary. Kids can read to learn or just for fun. Note: You can sign up for free for a month. After that, Genesis may have school accounts.
- **Rivet** – A Google App for Reading (Grades Pre-K to 5): For young and/or struggling readers. Download from Google Play (Info: <https://rivet.area120.com/>)
- **E-Read Kids** – Library Books (All Grades) – This is a public library program that provides on-line access to book catalogs. You need a library card and a pin. https://georgialibraries.org/ereadkids/?fbclid=IwAR2C1qX_h2yyy923A7r7ms58xJnDRf7ClcwWeXCNo6-5ma4Jz6SuKZ1ys5k
